We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for the Redford Union Virtual Learning Program. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as NO LABEL/UNIVERSAL SUPPORT school.

Weekly student attendance in the Redford Union Virtual program is a challenge for our program – which reflects in our reading and math scores. After-school tutoring, PSAT and SAT prep workshops, credit recovery classes, and remediation content built into our curriculum are some of the key initiatives that we are undertaking to assist our students.

While we are making notable strides and our student achievement has improved since the COVID-19 pandemic, the staff in the Redford Union Virtual Learning

program is fully committed to improving student achievement each semester, as we will not settle for mediocrity.
