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Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2015-16 educational progress for Hilbert Middle School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2017-18 year, no new Priority or Focus schools were named; some Priority or Focus schools did exit their status because they met the exit criteria. New Reward schools were identified using school rankings and Beating the Odds information. A Focus school is one that has a large achievement gap between the highest and lowest achieving 30% of schools. A Priority school is one whose achievement and growth is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Reward school is one that has achieved one or more of the following distinctions: top 5% of schools on the Top-to-Bottom School Rankings, top 5% of schools making the greatest gains in achievement (improvement metric), or "Beating the Odds" by outperforming the school's predicted ranking and/or similar schools. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels; however, we do have some key challenges to overcome. Among these challenges are meeting the 95% required participation rate. We continue to work on attendance and have continued with a district attendance campaign. The district has contracted with an attendance liaison to work with students and families to improve our attendance. We have continued to improve our communication with our parents and students through the use of automated calls, parent meetings, mass emails, and Remind 101 in order to keep our families up to date on important events.

Hilbert Middle School has been accepted into International Baccalaureate (IB)

candidacy. Throughout the next few years we will be working to align our curriculum with the IB framework and adopting all of IB best practices for instruction, assessment and community involvement.

Hilbert Middle School is also employing WEB Connect next year as a way to mentor incoming 6th graders and help them with the transition to middle school.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL: At Hilbert Middle School all students, with the exception of those attending the day treatment program, assigned to the middle school.

2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN: Redford Union is in the second year of our new school improvement plan. We completed our five year cycle last school year and received accreditation in February 2016.

5. IDENTIFY THE NUMBER AND PERCENT OF STUDENTS REPRESENTED BY PARENTS AT PARENT-TEACHER CONFERENCES: We offer parent teacher conferences two times per year, at varying times of the day. Approximately 47% of students were represented at fall conferences. We encourage all parents and families to be actively engaged in our school.

We are excited about the direction our school and district are heading and our cognizant of the challenges that face us.
