Originated by Beech Elementary's School Social Worker, Jason Maples, and led by PBIS Leader, Taylor Rais, the PBIS Council of Kids meets every two weeks to discuss ways to enhance student engagement and promote a positive school culture. What makes this council unique is that it's entirely student-driven, allowing the young leaders to bring their perspectives and ideas to the table. This student-led approach not only empowers students but also ensures that their voices are heard and valued in the decision-making process.

The PBIS Council of Kids has been hard at work brainstorming and implementing initiatives to further strengthen the learning environment and culture at Beech. From organizing fun events like Hat Days to collaborating with the kindergarten class to establish a recycling program, these students are making a tangible difference in the Redford Union school community.

Part of the mission of the PBIS Council of Kids is its commitment to inclusivity and diversity. To ensure a broad range of perspectives are represented, the council changes its members regularly. By the end of the school year, four different students from each classroom will have had the opportunity to participate, ensuring that a diverse group of voices contribute to the planning process.
