Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2023-24 educational progress for Redford Union Junior High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. If you have any questions about the AER, please contact Principal Carissa Peterson for assistance.

For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state, had a graduation rate at or below 67%, or failed to exit ATS status in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was identified as a 'COMPREHENSIVE SUPPORT AND IMPROVEMENT' SCHOOL.

A key challenge for our school is that a high percentage of students enter, and they are already many grade levels below in reading and math. As a team, we have implemented a proactive approach to help solve this problem. All students take the NWEA three times a year to measure growth and ensure that students are on target for making their annual gains so that they can adequately reach grade level proficiency on standardized testing. We expect at minimum one year of growth for all students in one year's time. With our 7th and 8th grade ELA and Math enrichment and foundations classes, students are given a double student of the content area and instruction is individualized to meet their unique needs. This is a way for the team to not only make sure that all students are receiving grade level appropriate curriculum, but that they are being given extra time to work on the foundational skills which some of them are lacking. During our advisory periods, Panther Time, a group of students, are also using high dosage/on demand tutoring to bridge the gaps between where students currently are and where they need to be.

State law requires that we also report additional information.

1. PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL- All students who leave Beech and Hilbert Elementary schools as 6th grade students are automatically enrolled at Redford Union Junior High School. The district also has open enrollment for the fall and spring semester for our out of district students who wish to apply for assignment to RUJH.
2. THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN-Our school improvement plan focuses on goals in math, reading and student behavior.

Approximately 40% of students were represented at fall conferences. We encourage all parents and families to be actively engaged in our school and set appointments with our team during mutually agreeable times.

The staff and administration look forward to continuing our partnership with our students and their families. Our goal is to help all students achieve their goals. We are excited about the direction our school and district are heading and are prepared to proactively address any obstacles that stand in the way of our success. We recognize the importance of staff, students and community working in collaboration as we embark on exciting new opportunities in a continuous effort for improvement and excellence.
