

Redford Union Girls Flag Football Dominates Ford Field

Redford Union High School launched Girls Flag Football this school year as a club sport, with 20 studentathletes participating in the school's inaugural season. Run through the Detroit Lions, the Redford Union team joined the league in its second year alongside 23 other teams throughout the state.

Earlier this month, the Redford Union Girls Flag Football team had the opportunity to take on Detroit Renaissance at Ford Field. The Lady Panthers dominated the Phoenix, posting an impressive 31-12 victory. The team's season ended this month with a 2-0-1 record.
